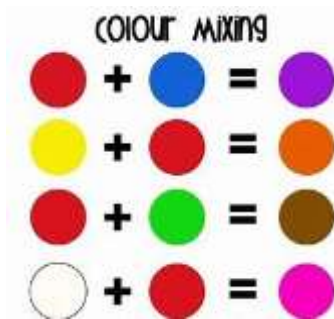

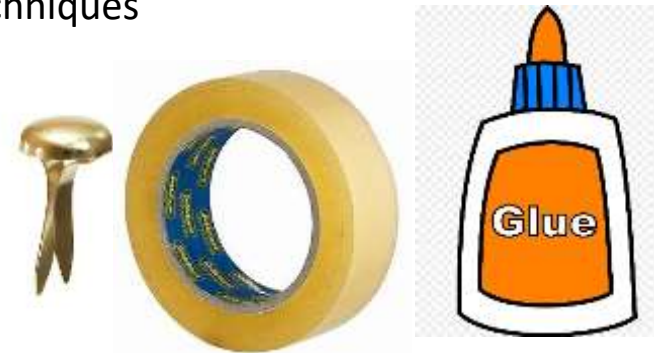

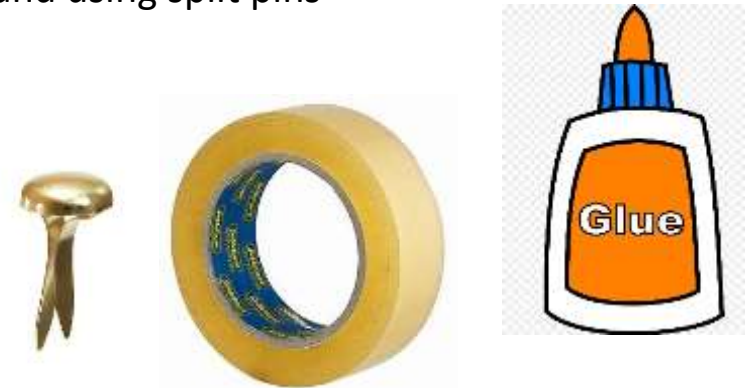

- Prints can be made by applying paint directly to an object before stamping eg fingers, hands, feet, blocks, vegetables etc.



- Prints can be made by making a collage and rolling paint over it eg string printing, leaf printing etc.



- Stencils can be used to make prints

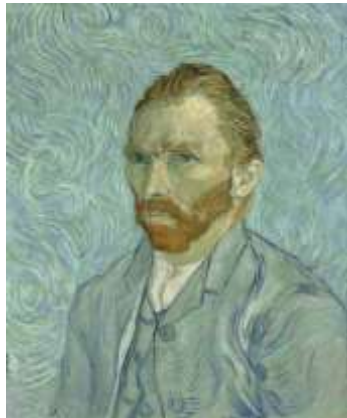
